SUBJECT : **CREATION OF INSPECTION AND EVALUATION TEAM FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMIT TO OPERATE**

DATE : SEPTEMBER 10, 2021

1. Among the powers, duties, and responsibilities of a Regional Director stated in Section 19.2 of DepEd Order No. 88 s. 2010, otherwise known as 2010 Revised Manual of Regulations for Private Schools in Basic Education is approving the establishment of public and private elementary and high schools and learning centers.
2. The above Order, however, was amended by virtue of DepEd Order No. 11 s. 2011 entitled 'Amendments to the 2010 Revised Manual of Regulations for Private Schools in Basic Education.' Section 30 of this issuance specifies that **application for the authority to open** a new school, or operate a new course/year level by existing pre-elementary, elementary and secondary schools, shall be submitted to the Regional Office, or subject to the authority of the Regional Director, to the Division Office.....' Further, stated therein is 'The Regional Office shall assess the completeness of the documentary requirements attached to the subject application..... If all the documentary requirements are complete or the school has already complied, the Regional Office shall conduct ocular inspection and evaluation of the applicant school's compliance with the minimum standards set for the program applied for..'
3. In consonance also with Republic Act 11054 of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region In Muslim Mindanao, the authority to approve the establishment of public private elementary and high schools and learning centers is vested upon the Minister of the Ministry of Basic, Higher and Technical Education as clarified in Article 9, Section 16, Paragraph 3 of RA 11054 otherwise known as the Bangsamoro Organic Law (BOL) which partly states that 'Any school, college or university existing in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Regional as of the effectivity of this organic law, and such other schools and institutions that maybe established hereinafter, shall be deemed integral components of the educational system of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region,....' Furthermore, paragraph 5 of the same section partly states that "The Bangsamoro Government shall supervise and regulate private schools, including sectarian and nonsectarian institutions of learning in any level."





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4. Corollary to above duties and areas of evaluation incumbent upon the Office of the Minister, the following are hereby constituted as the Technical Working Team if the Ministry's Inspection and Evaluation Team for the Issuance of Permit to Operate.

5. The TWG shall have the primary function of conducting ocular inspection and evaluation of required documents for the issuance of Permit to Operate, pending permanent Organizational Structure and staffing pattern of Basic Education.
6. In the light of the above, permanent members may assign alternates from their office to perform their assigned tasks, at times when they cannot perform such. To make their membership official as alternates, a separate memorandum shall be issued once they have already been identified.
7. Any existing issuances which are contrary to or inconsistent with this memorandum shall be deemed repealed or modified accordingly.
