WRITERS' WORKSHOP FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF K-3 TEACHING

LEARNING MATERIALS FOR THE BANGSAMORO LEARNERS

- Adarna House, in partnership with Education Pathways to Peace in Mindanao, with support from the Australian Government, has been tapped to support the Ministry of Basic, Higher and Technical Education's (MBHTE) 5Bs program in developing Teaching Learning Materials (TLMs) for Kinder to Grade 3 learners. The TLMs, while child-friendly, gender-sensitive, inclusive, and culturally sensitive, will focus on early literacy and numeracy incorporating socio-emotional learning (SEL), peace education, Islamic Values and Arabic Language, Bangsamoro values, history, cultural sensitivity, and Bangsamoro identity. Moreover, each TLM will be translated into the eight (8) Mother Tongue languages recommended by Pathways: Bahasa Sug, Magindanawn, Yakan, Chavacano, Iranun, Sinama, and Teduray.
- In this relation, a writers' workshop will be conducted to begin the development of K-3 teaching-learning materials and facilitate collaboration among writers, learning resource evaluators, editors, and project specialists.
- 3. Specifically, the activity aims to:
  - a. establish baseline knowledge on the importance of using literature in the classroom:
  - b. establish baseline knowledge of how Bangsamoro history, culture, and identity have been portrayed in children's literature;
  - c. identify opportunities that Bangsamoro history, culture, and identity can be properly introduced/explained to children;
  - d. orient the writers on how to develop TLMs following level-appropriate guidelines on the following:
    - essential features of a good children's book i.
    - ii. most essential competencies and skills that need to be addressed by **TLMs**
    - III. text readability
    - inclusive writing iv.



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- e. orient the writers on the book development process and the collaborative writing method to be used for this project that integrates writers with specialists and learning resource evaluators;
- f. orient the writers on the different elements of writing: plot, character development, outlining, the role of illustration; and
- g. provide the writers with the opportunity to start developing their stories (from topic selection to final story briefs and outlines) with the support of editors and learning resource evaluators.
- The activity will be conducted on October 24-26, 2022 (exclusive of travel dates) in General Santos City (specific venue will be confirmed and shall be communicated directly to the participants).
- 5. All participants are required to bring a laptop and must present their valid government IDs and vaccination cards upon check-in at the hotel.
- 6. Food, accommodation, transportation, and per diem of the participants and facilitators will be covered by Adama House subject to their regular accounting and auditing procedures. Adama House will provide a vehicle (van) for participants from the mainland divisions. The division office shall be the point of origin as the basis for transportation back and forth. Receipts for transportation not arranged by Adama House must be presented upon claiming reimbursement.
- The deadline for the final roster of participants is on October 14, 2022. Requests for participant additions and/or substitutions made beyond this date cannot be guaranteed.
