CLASS RESUMPTION FOR SCHOOLS AFFECTED BY THE RECENT

EMERGENCY BROUGHT ON BY TYPHOON PAENG

DATE November 3, 2022

- 1. Pursuant to Proclamation No. 0004 dated 29 October 2022, the BARMM Office of the Chief Minister declared the whole Bangsamoro Autonomous Region under the State of Calamity due to Typhoon Paeng.
- 2. The Ministry assessed different levels of damages among 250 schools that have been heavily affected by the typhoon last October 28, 20022, which caused flooding and landslides in the different parts of the region.
- 3. Considering the impact being faced by the affected schools, the Ministry recognizes the challenges in the resumption of classes amidst the devastations brought by the typhoon. For this purpose, schools have been categorized into 4 (four) depending on the extent of damage and impact: (1) Heavily Affected Schools; (2) Moderately Affected Schools; (3) Slightly Affected Schools; and, (4) Schools Used as Evacuation Centers.
 - a. Heavily Affected Schools are recommended to resume classes on November 20, 2022. This will give time for the school to do necessary activities to ensure the safe and secure resumption of school operations. The following activities can be conducted by the schools: (a) clearing and activities, (b) assessment of the integrity of facility/infrastructures, (c) learners tracking, (d) MHPSS, and (e) Education in



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Emergencies sessions mixed with formal learning and Psychosocial Support Services (PSS).

- b. Moderately Affected Schools are recommended to resume classes on November 10, 2022. Schools belonging to this category shall conduct the following activities but are not limited to (a) clearing and cleaning activities, (b) assessment of the integrity of school facility/infrastructures, (c) learners tracking, and (d) MHPSS.
- c. **Slightly Affected Schools** are enjoined to resume regular classes following the RO 792, s. 2022 entitled "MBHTE-BARMM School Calendar and Activities for the School Year 2022-2023".
- d. Schools Used as Evacuation Centers shall resume regular classes using the Adaptive Learning Modality (ALM) for a period of 15 days. If the use of the school as an evacuation center is predicted to exceed 15 days, the school heads, LGUs and other stakeholders shall agree on the appropriate modality to ensure continuity of teaching and learning activities.
