SUBJECT : **AMENDMENT TO THE MBHTE MEMORANDUM ORDER NO. 792, S. 2022:  
SCHOOL CALENDAR AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE SY 2022-2023 AND THE  
IMPLEMENTATION OF FULL 5-DAY IN-PERSON CLASSES IN BARMM**

DATE : November 4, 2022

1. This has reference to the issued MBHTE Memorandum Order No. 792, s. 2022 dated July 18, 2022, re **MBHTE-BARMM School Calendar and Activities for the School Year 2022-2023**.
2. Based on the results of the field monitoring and consultations with the Schools Division Offices (SDOs) and some school principals and administrators, there are schools that are ready to implement the **full 5-day in-person classes**. However, there are schools, having unprecedented increases in enrolment that manifested difficulty in implementing a full 5-day regular classes. Thus, the Ministry deemed it necessary to amend **paragraphs 15 and 16** of the MBHTE-Memorandum Order No. 792 s 2022 as follows:

Given school-level realities, the Ministry enjoins all School Divisions to consult and identify schools who may opt to design class programs for the Second Quarter based on the **options** below:

- Option 1 **Full 5-day** in-person classes (Regular class program); and  
Option 2 **4-day** in-person classes with 1 day for learning recovery programs (Transition class program).

3. All schools, including private schools, shall consult with their stakeholders and collectively decide on the best option that the school shall implement. The school shall submit a written request addressed to the Schools Division Superintendent (SDS) highlighting the collective decision of the stakeholders in choosing the best option for the school, the teachers, and the learners. The SDS shall endorse the list of schools, with corresponding applicable options for each school, for approval of the Director General for Basic Education.
4. However, all schools should prepare to implement full 5-day in-person classes when classes resume on 4 January 2023 and shall continue to be implemented until the end of the School Year.



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5. Affirming further, Enclosure 1 Item V – General Guidelines Paragraph 10 of the MBHTE Memorandum Order which states that *“No inspections, tools, or any additional requirements to re-open schools and to implement 5 days in-person classes shall be required, except for the compliance with the usual pre-pandemic regulatory permits and licenses, as required by law or ordinances”*.
6. Likewise, the schedule of First Quarter break and In-Service Training for Teachers from November 7 to 13, 2022 as stated in Enclosure No 2 of the MBHTE Memorandum Order is adjusted to **December 12-18, 2022**.
7. Given this adjustment, schools shall continue to hold classes until December 9, 2022.
8. All other provisions of the MBHTE Memorandum Order No. 792, s. 2022 shall remain effective unless otherwise amended by proper authority.

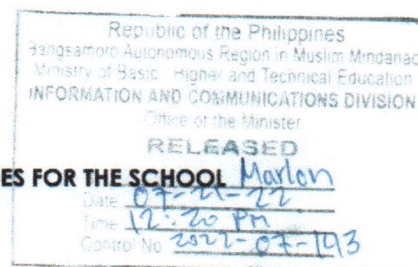

1. In view of the issuance of DepEd Order (DO) No. 034, s. 2022 otherwise known as the "School Calendar and Activities for the School Year (SY) 2022-2023" which provides for the implementation guidelines on the school calendar and activities for the SY 2022-2023, the Ministry of Basic, Higher and Technical Education hereby issues the enclosed contextualized guidelines to be implemented in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao.
2. Pursuant to Republic Act 11480, "An Act Amending the Section 3 of RA No. 7797, otherwise known as An Act to Lengthen the School Calendar from Two Hundred (200) Days to Not More Than Two Hundred Twenty (220) Class Days", and in consistent with DO No. 34, s. 2022, the SY 2022-2023 shall formally open on Monday, August 22, 2022, and shall end on July 7, 2023.
3. Private schools and state/local universities offering Basic Education may implement this school calendar, provided however that they start classes not earlier than the first Monday of June and not later than the last day of August.
4. Learning interventions, such as Alternative Learning System (ALS), shall formally open on the same date.
5. The number of school days in this Memorandum Order shall solely be dedicated to academics and related co-curricular activities.
6. In preparation for the opening of classes, Brigada Eskwela and Oplan Balik Eskwela shall be conducted, focusing on child mapping/finding, information campaigns and strengthening partnerships that complement the Ministry's effort to ensure integrated quality of education.
7. Considering the effect of pandemic and school closures to learning, the SY shall integrate learning recovery programs that aim to accelerate learning of all types of learners in BARMM.
8. This shall take effect immediately upon issuance.
9. All orders, memoranda, and other related issuances inconsistent with this policy and guidelines are deemed amended accordingly upon its effectivity.
10. For information, immediate dissemination, and strict compliance.

SUBJECT : **AMENDMENT TO THE MBHTE MEMORANDUM ORDER NO. 792, S. 2022 AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF FULL 5-DAY IN-PERSON CLASSES IN BARMM**

DATE : October 26, 2022

1. This has reference to the issued MBHTE Memorandum Order No. 792, s. 2022 dated July 18, 2022, re **MBHTE-BARMM School Calendar and Activities for the School Year 2022-2023**.
2. Based on the results of the field monitoring and consultations with the Schools Division Offices (SDOs) and some school principals and administrators, there are schools that are ready to implement the **full 5-day in-person classes**. However, there are schools, having unprecedented increases in enrolment that manifested difficulty in implementing a full 5-day regular classes. Thus, the Ministry deemed it necessary to amend **paragraphs 15 and 16 of the MBHTE Memorandum Order No. 792, s 2022**:

*Given school-level realities, the Ministry enjoins all School Divisions to consult and identify schools who may opt to design class programs for the Second Quarter based on the **options** below:*

Option 1 **Full 5-day in-person classes (Regular class program);**

Option 2 **4-day in-person classes with .5 day for learning recovery programs and .5 day for school reflection/LAC sessions/planning (Transition class program);**

3. All schools, including private schools, shall consult with their stakeholders and collectively decide on the best option that the school shall implement. The school shall submit a written request addressed to the Schools Division Superintendent (SDS) highlighting the collective decision of the stakeholders in choosing the best





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option for the school, the teachers, and the learners. The SDS shall endorse the list of schools, with corresponding applicable options for each school, for approval of the Director General for Basic Education.

4. However, all schools should prepare to implement full 5-day in-person classes when classes resume on 4 January 2023 and shall continue to be implemented until the end of the School Year.
5. Affirming further, Enclosure 1 Item V – General Guidelines Paragraph 10 of the MBHTE Memorandum Order which states that *"No inspections, tools, or any additional requirements to re-open schools and to implement 5 days in-person classes shall be required, except for the compliance with the usual pre-pandemic regulatory permits and licenses, as required by law or ordinances"*.
6. Likewise, the schedule of the First Quarter break and In-Service Training for Teachers from November 7-13, 2022 as stated in Enclosure No 2 of the MBHTE Memorandum Order is adjusted to **December 12-18, 2022**.
7. Given this adjustment, schools shall continue to hold classes until December 9, 2022.
8. All other provisions of the MBHTE Memorandum Order No. 792, s. 2022 shall remain effective unless otherwise amended by the proper authority.
