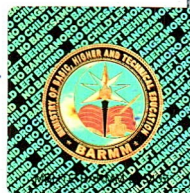

SUBJECT : **TRAINING OF COURSE TRAINERS AND FACILITATORS FOR THE IN-SERVICE TRAINING FOR TEACHERS**

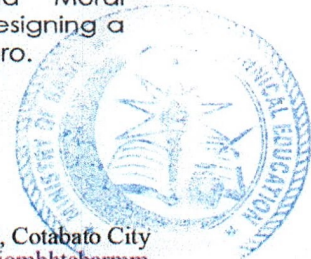
I. Background

Article 9, Section 16 of the Bangsamoro Organic Law (RA 11054) states that "The Bangsamoro Government shall establish an education framework that is relevant and responsive to the needs, ideals and aspirations of the Bangsamoro people". This is further emphasized in the Bangsamoro Act No. 18 or the Bangsamoro Education Code, particularly on the articulation of the seven (7) principles namely: inclusivity; equity; rights-based; rooted in context; integrated; balanced; and moral governance.

The abovementioned laws provide the legal platform for the Ministry to develop and implement an in-service training program aimed at transforming education workers in Bangsamoro to deliver relevant and responsive education that would improve learning outcomes and address learning losses brought about by the Covid19 pandemic.

Given this, the Ministry formulated the Professional and Moral Development Program (PMDP) for school administrators, teachers, and other education support personnel. Different courses are designed for each sector. There will be five (5) courses for school administrators, six (6) courses for teachers, and three (3) courses for education support personnel. However, training courses may be added as needed.

Specifically, the Bangsamoro Teachers Professional and Moral Development (BTPMD) standards were formulated as a guide in designing a contextualized in-service training program for teachers in Bangsamoro.

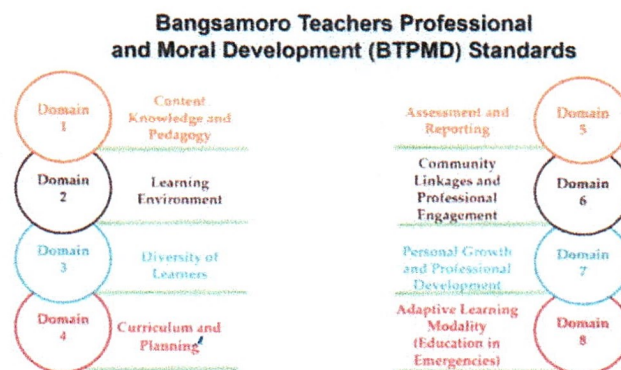


Figure 1: BTPMD Domains

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The BTPMD highlights 8 domains as shown in Figure 1 below:

The BTPMD is designed to equip teachers with skills, knowledge, attitudes, and values that will improve the delivery of relevant content considering the needs of all types of 21st-century learners in Bangsamoro. Thus, the in-service trainings will enhance the capacities of teachers to deliver quality instruction by ensuring learners benefit from effective teaching and learning processes.

Studies show that teachers are the most important factor in providing quality education and that supporting the professional development of teachers will contribute to the improvement of education systems (European Training Foundation, 2013). Improving learning performance has been shown to be directly related to teacher competency, values, and attitudes which are critical in providing quality education services.

II. Description

There shall be categorized-activity series designed according to the developmental stages of the learners as follow:

- **Stage 1:** Kindergarten to Grade 3 (literacy, numeracy, and socio-emotional learning) in support of the implementation of the 5Bs program
- **Stage 2:** Grades 4 to 6 (Walkthrough of Grades 4-6 MELC focusing on least learned areas; 21st Century Learner; 21st Century Teacher; Resilient Pedagogies and Assessment)
- **Stage 3:** Junior High School (Walkthrough of Grades 7-10 MELC on least learned areas; 21st Century Learner; 21st Century Teacher; Resilient Pedagogies Assessment)
- **Stage 4:** Senior High School (Review of Grades 11-12 MELC on Least Learned areas: Language and Communication; Science, Social Studies; Research and Human-Centered Design/ Design Thinking Process)



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III. Training of Course Trainers

Each Schools Division has selected a team of Course Trainers per Key Stage who will facilitate the In-Service Training of Teachers in their respective Divisions. They will go through rigorous training on the content and methodology of the In-Service Training Program by subject matter experts from the University of the Philippines System and other academic and non-governmental organizations. The training programs are accredited by the Philippine Regulations Commission (PRC) and/or the National Educators Academy of the Philippines (NEAP) with corresponding Continuing Professional Development (CPD) credits.

IV. Schedules and Venues of Training of Course Trainers

The training of Course trainers shall be conducted on the following dates and venues:

V. Participants, Resource Persons, and Regional Facilitators

The list of Course Trainers per division is herein attached as Annex A. It is understood that the participants of the Training of Course Trainers commit to finish the whole training and facilitate/conduct the In-Service Training for Teachers during the Division Roll-out on December 12-18, 2022 in their respective divisions.

Resource Persons for Key Stage 1 are experts on Literacy, Numeracy, and Social Emotional Learning in partnership with Pathways Program. Resource Persons for Key Stage 2, 3, and 4 are from University of the Philippines. The



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session on MHPSS shall be facilitated by resource persons from Save the Children Philippines (with names herein attached as ANNEX B). Resource Persons for Moral Governance in Education shall be from the Ministry and from the UP Institute for Islamic Studies. Inputs on Bangsamoro History shall be provided by in-house experts from the Ministry.

Teams of regional facilitators shall be mobilized to support the overall conduct of the training (with names herein attached as ANNEX C).

VI. Pre-Registration and Registration

All participants are requested to **Pre-register** via online form which can be accessed through this link bit.ly/PreRegINSET . Detailed **Registration** form shall be filled-up during the actual training.

VII. Transportation, Food, Accommodation, and Per Diem

The Ministry shall cover the food, accommodation, per diem, and reimbursement of economical means of transportation subject to usual accounting rules and regulations. To expedite the process of reimbursements, participants are enjoined to keep the necessary official receipts of travel expenses.
