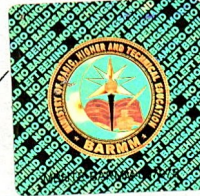

1. The Embassy of Canada recently engaged the services of Transforming Fragilities Inc. to conduct an **end-of-project evaluation for the project Animating Change: 1001 Nights Project for two (2) months starting June 12, 2023 at selected BARMM areas and schools.** The evaluation aims to help mitigate the adverse impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on education, particularly on marginalized children in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao (BARMM). This evaluation would identify lessons learned and best practices and help inform Canada's future initiatives.
2. In 2021, the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade, and Development (DFATD) of the Canadian Government through the Canadian Embassy in the Philippines signed a contribution agreement with Big Bad Boo Studios, Inc. to implement the project from March 2021 to June 2022, which sought to implement the 1001 Nights Civic and Peace Education Program to support the learning continuity of children in Grades 4-6 during COVID-19, while promoting peace and stability in the BARMM.
3. The 1001 Nights Program is a multi-platform educational entertainment program that uses cartoons to teach children between the ages of 6 and 12 life skills and civic values, including non-violence, human rights, democracy and gender equality, in formal and informal learning environments. By increasing children's understanding of civic values, this project aims to reduce the vulnerability of children in the BARMM to the drivers of instability.
4. Comes the evaluation, it aims to:
  - a. assess the project implementation performance in terms of relevance, effectiveness, impact, coherence, efficiency, and sustainability;
  - b. assess the extent by which the management capacities put in place supports the efforts to respond to the conditions, needs, challenges, and opportunities during project implementation; and

- c. document the lessons learned, best practices, and recommendations for future design and implementation of similar initiatives in the Philippines by Canada or any other development partners.
5. The full activity will cover two (2) months of evaluation process which includes:
  - Key Informant Interviews (KIIs) with Schools Division Superintendents, or their designated representatives;
  - Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) with teachers who participated in the 1001 Nights Project; and
  - Survey with Grades 4 to 6 pupils of schools where the 1001 Nights Project was implemented.
