## IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF BANGSAMORO AUTONOMY ACT NO. 50, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE BANGSAMORO KULLIYYAH FOR ISLAMIC STUDIES ACT OF 2023

Pursuant to Section 23 of Bangsamoro Autonomy Act No. 50 (BAA 50) or An Act Creating the Bangsamoro *Kulliyyah* for Islamic Studies, Repealing Muslim Mindanao Autonomy Act No. 164 (MMAA 164), Otherwise Known as the Regional Madrasah Graduate Education Act of 2003, Providing Funds Therefor and for Other Purposes, the following Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) are hereby issued:

## RULE I PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

- **Section 1. Title.** These rules and regulations shall be known as the "Implementing Rules and Regulations of the Bangsamoro *Kulliyyah* for Islamic Studies Act of 2023" and shall hereinafter be referred to as the "IRR" for brevity.
- Section 2. Declaration of Policy. It is the declared policy of the Bangsamoro Government under Article IX, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 11054 (RA 11054), otherwise known as the "Organic Law for the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao" to establish, maintain, and support a complete and integrated system of quality education, which shall be a subsystem of the national education system. The Bangsamoro Government shall develop an educational framework relevant and responsive to the needs, ideals, and aspirations of the Bangsamoro people. For this purpose, the Bangsamoro Government shall conform to the minimum standards set by the National Government.

To achieve these, and in recognition of the need to institutionalize Islamic studies as a component of the mainstream Bangsamoro education and to further peace education in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM), the Bangsamoro Government, through the Ministry of Basic, Higher and Technical Education (MBHTE), shall establish a Higher Education Institution (HEI) that shall offer specialized degrees in Islamic studies and Arabic language, aligned with the MBHTE's policies on, "no child in the Bangsamoro left behind" and "produce, at least one, professional in every family in the BARMM".

Section 3. Main Thrust. – Consistent with Article IX, Chapter 6, Sections 147 and 148 of Bangsamoro Autonomy Act No. 18 (BAA 18), otherwise known as the "Bangsamoro Education Code of 2021", the Bangsamoro Kulliyyah for Islamic Studies, otherwise known as the "Kulliyyah", as an institute of Islamic higher learning, shall instill Islamic values necessary

for the realization of the Bangsamoro education goals and shall also be a Centre for Educational Excellence and Research in Islamic Revealed Knowledge and Human Sciences.

It shall be responsible for the preparation of teachers for Islamic education and Arabic education in the Bangsamoro.

**Section 4. Scope and Application. –** These rules and regulations shall cover the administration, operations, and governance of the Bangsamoro *Kulliyyah* for Islamic Studies and all providers of its educational and auxiliary services which have been granted, or have applied for, authorization and accreditation from the MBHTE.

 Section 5. Interpretation. – These rules and regulations shall be construed and applied in accordance with and in furtherance of the policies and objectives of the BAA 50, BAA 18, Bangsamoro Autonomy Act No. 13 (BAA 13), otherwise known as the "Bangsamoro Administrative Code", RA 11054, Republic Act No. 8292 (RA 8292), otherwise known as the "Higher Education Modernization Act of 1997", and pertinent rules and regulations.

In case of doubt, the same shall be construed liberally in favor of the Bangsamoro Government and strictly against the Bangsamoro *Kulliyyah* for Islamic Studies.

## RULE II DEFINITION OF TERMS

- **Section 6. Definition of Terms. –** As used in this IRR, the following terms shall be understood to mean:
  - a. Academic Staff refers to qualified and competent teaching personnel who are engaged in actual teaching, research assignments, and/or other relevant mandates of the Kulliyyah, either on a full-time, contract of service/ job order or part-time basis, in all levels.
  - b. Act refers to Bangsamoro Autonomy Act No. 50 (BAA 50), otherwise known as the "Bangsamoro Kulliyyah for Islamic Studies Act of 2023."
  - Alumni refers to the graduate of the Kulliyyah including the graduates of the former REM Academy.
  - d. **Alumni Association** refers is an organized group or society of the alumni of the *Kulliyyah* and the Rem Academy which are certified or recognized by the Board through Kulliyyah Alumni Relations Office.

- e. **Auxiliary Services** refers to all kinds of services performed or rendered by the *Kulliyyah* other than academic, such as clinic, cafeteria, janitorial, printing press, bookstore, and the like.
- f. **Board** refers to the Board of Trustees of the *Kulliyyah*, the governing board i.e, the highest policy-making body of the *Kulliyyah*.
- g. Curricular Programs refers to the recognized academic programs, such as baccalaureate and postgraduate programs, including diploma, certificate or its equivalent, covering the mandatory curriculum and practicum specifications to strengthen professional practice.
- h. **Faculty Association** refers to the sole registered or accredited faculty organization of the faculty members of the *Kulliyyah*, its campus, or department, duly registered or accredited by the Civil Service Commission Personnel Relations Office (CSC-PRO) and Ministry of Labor and Employment Bureau of Labor Relations (MOLE-BLR) for their mutual aid and protection.
- i. **Higher Education Institution (HEI)** refers to an institution of higher learning in the Philippines primarily offering degree-granting programs.
- j. Human Sciences refer to the knowledge that study human life and behavior excluding spiritual aspects, such as Sociology, Psychology, Political Sciences, and others.
- k. Islamic Revealed Knowledge refers to the knowledge that is derived from the Qur'an and the Sunnah of the Prophet or traditions of Prophet Muhammad (SAW). It includes but not limited to Aqeedah (Theology), Figh (Islamic Jurisprudence), Tafsir (Qur'anic Exegeses), Ulum ul Qur'an, Ulum ul Hadith.
- Islamic Revealed Knowledge and Human Sciences refers to a
  unique interdisciplinary program of the Kulliyyah that study Human
  Sciences with the integration of the Islamic Revealed Knowledge
  and aim to balance the material progress with spiritual and moral
  standard.
- j. Kulliyyah refers to the Bangsamoro Kulliyyah for Islamic Studies (BKIS).
- k. **Ministry** refers to the Ministry of Basic, Higher and Technical Education (MBHTE).
- Moral Governance refers to the set of rules, practices, and processes completely devoid of all the evils of graft and corruption,

and explicitly driven by the moral principles of utmost dedication, 142 devotion, honesty, justice, and integrity. 143 144 m. Private Islamic Institution (PII) - refers to any existing Islamic 145 Educational Institution within the BARMM region the offer Islamic 146 Education, such as private Jami'ah, private Kulliyyah, Private 147 Madrasah, and Toril, which are recognized by MBHTE. 148 149 n. Private Islamic Institutions Representative (PIIR) refers to the Board 150 151 member who is a prominent citizen representing MBHTE-recognized 152 private Islamic institutions, distinguished in his or her profession or field 153 of specialization aligned to the mandate of the Kulliyyah, and possesses none of the disqualifications under this IRR. 154 155 o. REMACADEMY refers to the Regional Madrasah Graduate Academy 156 which was created by virtue of MMAA 164. It is a government-157 supported academic institution of higher learning in Islamic and 158 Arabic studies. 159 160 p. Special Trust Funds refers to the total amount collected or charged 161 from the students for tuition and other fees for a specific purpose. 162 163 including the collection and receipts from sources other than 164 payment of tuition fees, held in trust by the Kulliyyah. 165 q. Specialized Program Offerings - refer to curriculum programs 166 167 tailored to specific fields or areas of interest relevant to the BARMM 168 context. 169 170 r. Student Trustee refers to the President of the Student Government 171 Organization elected by the student council. 172 173 **RULE III** 174 LOCATION 175 176 Section 7. Location. - The Kulliyyah shall be situated in the Municipality of 177 Buluan, Province of Maguindanao del Sur, and such other areas as may be determined by the Board. 178 179 **RULE IV** 180 MANDATE 181 182 Section 8. Mandate. - The Kulliyyah shall be an institution of specialized higher 183 learning which shall primarily provide baccalaureate and graduate 184 degree programs. It shall promote instruction, research, extension 185 services, including resource generation, and leading innovation in its 186 areas of specialization. 187

**Section 9. Moral Governance.** - It shall also institutionalize moral governance that is inclusive and reflective of the aspirations and ideals of the Bangsamoro people. Moral governance shall be operationalized in the *Kulliyyah* in the following manners:

- a. **Academic Integration** Moral governance shall be embedded in all curricular offerings, with courses explicitly covering ethics, and Islamic moral principles. Specialized courses on moral governance, Islamic law, and ethical leadership shall be developed to promote these values among students.
- b. Research and Community Engagement All research activities shall adhere to ethical standards aligned with moral governance, with a focus on promoting social justice, transparency, and the public good. Extension services shall prioritize projects that address inequality and empower the Bangsamoro community.
- c. Administrative Practices The Kulliyyah shall adopt a Code of Conduct for all members, ensuring that transparency, accountability, and ethical leadership are practiced at all levels. Ethics committees shall be established to oversee compliance with these principles.

## RULE V CURRICULAR OFFERINGS

- **Section 10.** Curricular Offerings. The Ministry shall issue the guidelines for crafting the curricular offerings of the Kulliyyah.
- **Section 11. Coordination with CHED.** The Kulliyyah shall coordinate with CHED through the Ministry for alignment of its programs.
- **Section 12. Specialized Program Offerings.** The Kulliyyah, through the Board, has the power to introduce, craft, and implement specialized program offerings relevant to the Bangsamoro region, subject to the approval of the Ministry and in coordination with the CHED.
- **Section 13. Existing Programs.** For degree programs already recognized by CHED, the *Kulliyyah* shall conduct regular review of its programs to ensure alignment with CHED standards, and compliance with the requirements of the Ministry.
- Section 14. New Programs. For new programs not currently recognized by the CHED, the Kulliyyah shall follow the procedure as adopted by the Ministry. The Kulliyyah shall promote the development of interdisciplinary programs that integrate Islamic Studies with other fields of specialization.

The 297 Offices of the Director-General for Madaris Education (DGME) and Director-General for Higher Education (DGHE) shall jointly seek 298 nominations of PIIR candidates from the Private Islamic Institutions. 299 The same Offices shall-initiate the call for nominations through 300 301 publication using local or regional newspapers, multi-media channels, radio, letters to various civic, social, and/or professional 302 organizations, social media sites, or online announcements, amona 303 304 others. The Invitation for Application or Nomination shall be published for at least two (2) consecutive weeks. The notice shall 305 include the minimum qualifications under Section 2.2, the 306 documentary requirements under Section 2.3, the deadline for 307 308 submitting the requirements, and the place for submission of the application or nomination. 309 310 17.2. Minimum Eligibility Requirements and/or Standards for the PIIR in the 311 312 Board. - The PIIR must meet the following minimum conditions for 313 selection: 314 315 a. Be a Filipino citizen and of legal age; 316 317 b. Must be holding an administrative position in Private Islamic 318 Institution: 319 c. Have at least five (5) years of employment, business, or practice 320 321 of profession in the private sector; 322 d. 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17.4. **Deadline for Submission of Applications or Nominations.** – The Offices of the DGME and DGHE shall determine the deadline for the submission of applications or nominations in accordance with the timeline set by the Office of the Minister (OMIN). Application or nominations shall be sent through the Secretariat constituted by the Offices of the DGME and DGHE, addressed to the Minister not later than ninety (90) days before the expiration of the term of the incumbent PIIR.

Applications, nominations, and other documentary requirements shall be filed personally, through a representative, by registered mail, or by authorized private courier, with the Secretariat, provided that all applications or nominations must be received on or before the deadline. Online submission of documents may be allowed subject to submission of hard copies of the same.

17.5. **Processing and Screening of PIIR Nominees.** – The Offices of the DGME and DGHE shall conduct a series of meetings to evaluate all the applications, nominations, documentations, and references submitted to it. It shall, at its discretion, initiate and conduct validation processes of these materials.

Only those applicants or nominees who meet the minimum requirements will be considered for inclusion in the short list of candidates.

In case there are less than the required candidates, the Office of the DGME may set a new period for submission of applications or nominations.

In any case, the Offices of the DGME and DGHE shall submit its report and recommendation not later than (30) days prior to the expiration of the term of the incumbent PIIR.

- 17.6. Selection Criteria for Candidates. All qualified applicants and nominees for the PIIR may be evaluated using the following criteria:
  - a. Prestige and prominence of the applicant or nominee;
  - b. Past and current membership in civic, social, religious, and professional organizations;
  - c. Past and current achievements in the field of specialization; and
  - d. Knowledge, expertise, depth, and breadth of experience

17.7. **Ranking and Recommendation**. – The Offices of the DGME and DGHE shall rank candidates using an evaluation tool and prepare a shortlist of the required three (3) candidates.

The Offices of the DGME and DGHE shall also prepare a joint report on all the nominations, pertinent documentation and references it received, as well as the result of the validation process it conducted on the qualified candidates' prominence, achievements, and reputation. From these, the Office of the DGME shall state the bases for its recommendations of the three (3) highest ranked candidates to the OMIN to fill up the PIIR in the Board.

The joint reports and recommendations of the Offices of the DGME and DGHE shall be submitted to the OMIN within sixty (60) days from the closing of applications and nominations for the PIIR position but not later than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the term of the incumbent PIIR.

- 17.8. **Selection of the PIIR.** The Minister shall select and appoint the PIIR from the list of candidates per recommendation of the Offices of the DGME and DGHE.
- 17.9. Completion of the Search. The search process shall be completed within a period of three (3) months.
- 17.10. **Terms and Conditions of the PIIR.** The terms and conditions for the PIIR shall be as follows:
  - a. The PIIR shall serve for a term of two (2) years. A PIIR shall not, after his or her term ends, act in a hold-over capacity.
  - b. In case of death, incapacity, resignation, or other analogous reasons, the PIIR's position shall be deemed vacated. A new search process for a new PIIR must be established in accordance with the provisions of this IRR. The new PIIR shall serve the full term of two (2) years.
- 17.11. Confidentiality of Information. The Offices of the DGME and DGHE, the Secretariat, and the OMIN shall not use or divulge confidential information officially known to its members by reason of their office and not made available to the public, either:
  - a. To further their private interests, or give undue advantage to anyone; or,
  - b. To prejudice the public interest.

Section 18. No Compensation for the Chairperson, Vice-Chairpersons, and 465 Members of the Board: Reimbursement and Honorarium. - The Board 466 shall serve without compensation, but they shall be reimbursed for: 467 468 a. Necessary Expenses, the amount of which shall be based on 469 existing government issuances, incurred in their attendance in the 470 Board meetings or in connection with the conduct of official 471 business authorized by resolution of the Board; and, 472 b. Honorarium, the amount of which is subject to applicable rules on 473 474 honorgrium. 475 476 The reimbursement for necessary expenses and the honorarium shall 477

be subject to existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

Section 19. Meetings. - The Board may hold regular meetings or special meetings.

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- 19.1. Regular Meetings. The Board must regularly convene at least once every quarter.
- 19.2. Special Meetings. The Chairperson may call for a special meeting as the need arises.

A member of the Board may also propose for the conduct of a special meeting through a written request to the Chairperson at least five (5) days prior to the date of the intended special meeting.

- 19.3. Frequency, Date, and Venue of Regular and/or Special Meetings. - The frequency and the date and venue of regular meetings of the Board shall be determined by the Board itself, provided that the Members shall receive the authorized allowances in only four (4) regular meetings and four (4) special meetings per year, for purposes of budget computation.
- 19.4. Responsibility of the Kulliyyah President. The Kulliyyah President shall be responsible in ensuring the smooth holding of the Board's regular meetings or special meetings. He/She must ensure, through the Board Secretary, the preparation of the agenda folders for Board Meetings to be provided to the Chairperson and Members at least five (5) days prior to any regular meeting and one (1) day prior to a special session.
- 19.5. Minutes of Meeting. The minutes of Board meetings shall be confidential in character. Any request for a copy of the minutes or excerpts shall be subject to the approval of the Vice-Chairpersons, subject to existing laws and regulations. The approval or denial of request shall be appealable to the Chairperson.

512 The minutes of the meeting shall be open to inspection/reproduction by any Member upon demand in writing. The inspecting or 513 reproducing party shall remain bound by confidentiality rules under 514 prevailing laws, such as the rules on trade secrets or processes under 515 516 Republic Act No. 8293, otherwise known as the "Intellectual Property Code of the Philippines," as amended, Republic Act No. 10173, 517 otherwise known as the "Data Privacy Act of 2012," and the Rules of 518 519 Court. 520 Section 20. Quorum. - A majority of all the members of the Board present and 521 holding office at the time of its regular meetings or special meetings, 522 shall constitute a quorum. 523 524 No regular meeting or special session of the Board, however, shall be 525 526 validly held without the Chairperson. 527 528 Section 21. Presiding Officer. - The Minister of MBHTE shall be the presiding 529

officer of the regular meetings and special meetings of the Board as its Chairperson.

#### Section 22. Manner of Voting.

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- A. Unless otherwise provided in the IRR, a Board Resolution shall be adopted by a majority of those present at a meeting in which there is a guorum. The method of voting shall be one of the following:
  - by showing of hands;
  - by voicing votes; ii.
  - iii. by casting ballots; or
- B. The Board may conduct its meetings via other modes, such as, but not limited to, the use of video teleconferencing. The attendance via other modes shall be counted in the determination of the quorum in the said meeting. Trustees cannot attend nor vote by proxy.
- C. The Chairperson shall not cast a vote except when his/her vote is necessary to attain a majority.
- D. Every decision voted upon by at least a majority of all members present shall be valid as an act of the Board.
- E. The Board shall furnish a copy of all Board Resolutions to the Ministry.

Section 23. Assumption to Office. - The Chairperson, Vice-Chairpersons, and 558 government officials who are Board members in an ex officio 559 capacity shall perform their functions and duties upon their 560 assumption to office. 561 The right of the Faculty Association and Alumni Association Presidents, 562 and the Student Government Organization President to become 563 members of the Board shall automatically arise from their election 564 and qualification as such. 565 566 Except ex officio members, all Board members must take their oaths 567 of office before they could assume their functions in the Board. 568 569 570 Section 24. Conflict of Interest. - A Board member shall recuse themselves from 571 voting on any matter in which he or she has interest or wherein conflict may arise. 572 573 Financial conflict of interest arises in a situation where one or more 574 575 Board members might gain or lose financially, directly or indirectly, as a result of the approval of the resolution. 576 577 A non-financial conflict of interest arises when the matter to be voted 578 579 for involves, directly or indirectly, one or more Trustees or their spouses 580 and/or relatives within the fourth civil degree of consanguinity or 581 582 affinity. 583 **RULE VIII** 584 585 STRUCTURE OF THE KULLIYYAH 586 587 Section 25. Composition. - The Kulliyyah's structure shall be composed of the 588 Board of Trustees, Office of the President, Academic Council, and Administrative Council. 589 590 591 The Office of the President shall be supported by appropriate Services, 592 Divisions, Sections, and Units. 593 594 Section 26. President of the Kulliyyah. - The administration of the Kulliyyah is vested in its President who shall render full-time service. 595 596 597 Section 27. The Kulliyyah President; Selection; Appointment. - The Kulliyyah President shall be selected and appointed by the Chief Minister upon 598 599 the recommendation of a duly-constituted Search Committee for Kulliyyah Presidency (SCKP). The Kulliyyah President shall have a salary 600

Section 28. Appointment of Officer-in-Charge in case of permanent vacancy in the Office of the President. – The Chief Minister shall designate an

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Officer-in-Charge for the *Kulliyyah* in case of permanent vacancy in the Office of the President by reason of death, compulsory retirement, resignation, removal for cause, or incapacity to perform the functions of the office, pending the appointment of a new President: *Provided*, That the Officer-in-Charge shall serve only for the unexpired portion of the term.

Designation to fill an unexpired term shall not be considered an appointment to a complete term.

Section 29. Creation of the Search Committee for Kulliyyah President (SCKP). –
The following conditions shall apply in the conduct of the search for the Kulliyyah President:

- a. The Board shall create a Search Committee for Kulliyyah President (SCKP) to search, screen, and recommend eligible candidates for Kulliyyah President, not later than six (6) months before the end of the term of the incumbent Kulliyyah President. The Board shall also designate the members of the SCKP Secretariat to assist the SCKP with its tasks and activities.
- b. The SCKP shall have at least five (5) members selected by the Board composed of qualified representatives from the academic community, the private Islamic higher institutions, MBHTE-Higher Education, MBHTE-Madaris Education, and MBHTE-Office of the Minister (OMIN). The Board shall designate the Chairperson of the SCKP from among the members of the SCKP. The SCKP shall meet twenty (20) days from its constitution.
- c. No SCKP member shall be related within the fourth civil degree of consanguinity or affinity, had or have personal, social, professional relationships, business interests or financial connections, and political party affiliations to an applicant for Kulliyyah President to avoid conflict of interest.
- d. If any of such relationship exists, the SCKP member shall disclose the relationship to the Board. The disclosure or discovery of such relationship and possible conflict of interest or partiality will serve as basis for the Board to decide whether to revoke the appointment of the concerned SCKP member.
- e. The representative of the private Islamic higher institutions in the SCKP must not in any way be directly or indirectly connected with the *Kulliyyah*.

f. To ensure the effective and efficient performance of its duties, the Board shall allocate a budget and provide the facilities of the *Kulliyyah* to the SCKP.

Section 30. Publication of Notice of Search for Kulliyyah President. – The SCKP shall, within one (1) month from its constitution, prepare the notice of search for Kulliyyah President and publish it in online media channels and at least one (1) newspaper of general circulation for at least three (3) consecutive weeks.

The notice shall include the minimum qualifications under Section 8, the documentary requirements under Section 9, the deadline for submitting the requirements, and the place for the submission of the application.

In addition to the requirements and processes mentioned in the immediately preceding provisions, the Ministry shall ensure that the Kulliyyah President position be published in compliance with Republic Act No. 7041 (RA 7041), otherwise known as the "Publication Law" and the 2017 Omnibus Rules on Appointments and Other Human Resource Actions (ORA-OHRA) (Revised July 2018) issued by the CSC.

**Section 31.** Manner of Submission. – The applications shall be sent through the SCKP Chairperson, addressed to the Office of the Chief Minister.

The applications and other documentary requirements shall be filed personally, through a representative, by registered mail, or by authorized private courier with the SCKP Secretariat, provided that all the applications must be received on or before the deadline.

- **Section 32.** Minimum Qualifications of the Kulliyah President. The minimum qualifications of any applicant for the Kulliyyah Presidency shall be:
  - a. Not less than thirty-five (35) years old and not a day older than the sixty-first (61st) birthday at the time of the expiration of the term of the incumbent Kulliyyah President;
  - b. A Filipino citizen;

- c. Holder of at least a Master's degree from a CHED-recognized HEI or foreign institution accredited by its respective higher education ministry/commission or appropriate regulatory body, which is defined as Level 7 in the Philippine Qualifications Framework (PQF), under Republic Act No. 10968, otherwise known as the "PQF Act";
- d. Must be able to read and write in Arabic Language;

With proven track record of academic leadership as SUC/LUC 698 administrator (e.g., president, vice-president, dean, campus 699 administrator, director) or high-level management 700 executive/administrator, whether in the public or private sector, 701 for at least five (5) years; Nomenclature of the position, especially 702 in the private sector may be clarified by the Board as long as the 703 position is high-level management; and, 704 f.  Certificates/Clearances at the time of the pre-evaluation process by the SCKP. The deadline of which can be set by the SCKP;

- Birth certificate authenticated by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA);
- g. Medical certificate of physical fitness issued by a physician from a government health institution not in any way connected with the applicant or the Kulliyyah;
- h. Drug testing certificate pursuant to the CSC Memorandum Circular No. 13, s. 2017;
- Neuro-psychiatric examination result obtained from a government health institution. In case there is none, the neuropsychiatric examination result shall be obtained from a DOHaccredited institution not connected with the applicant;
- j. Duly accomplished, computerized, and notarized Personal Data Sheet (CSC Form 212); and,
- k. Other documents that may be reasonably required by the Board.

The documentary requirements shall be submitted on or before the deadline specified in the published notice of search and call for applications referred to in Section 6.

**Section 34.** Submission and Pre-Evaluation Process. – The procedure for the submission and pre-evaluation of applications for the Kulliyyah Presidency is as follows:

- **34.1.** An applicant or his/her representative must submit all the required documents to the SCKP Secretariat within the prescribed period.
- 34.2. The SCKP Secretariat shall transmit the original and photocopies of the documents submitted by the applicant to the SCKP. All original documents submitted by an applicant that is accepted by the SCKP Secretariat must be returned to the applicant within sixty (60) days after the completion of the search and selection processes.
- **34.3.** The SCKP Secretariat shall submit a status report on the tasks delineated in Subsections 7.1 and 7.2, as well as a summary of documents received and the issues it encountered, to the SCKP Chairperson within ten (10) calendar days after the deadline set in the published notice.

34.4. Upon receipt of the SCKP Secretariat Report, the SCKP shall convene within a reasonable period to determine if the documents screened and pre-evaluated by the SCKP Secretariat are indeed complete. The SCKP shall also look into the documentary issues that the SCKP Secretariat encountered and reported, and all the documents attached to the report to validate the decision of the SCKP Secretariat. During this period, the SCKP is given the authority to ascertain, validate the validity of the compliance with the minimum requirements and/or documentary requirements.

- **34.5.** If the SCKP decides to disqualify an applicant because of failure to comply with all the minimum requirements and/or submit all the documentary requirements, it shall immediately inform the applicant, stating the reasons for the disqualification.
- 34.6. A motion for reconsideration (MR) of an applicant's disqualification may be filed with the SCKP and should be resolved by the SCKP within five (5) days from receipt of the MR. The decision of the SCKP may be appealed to the Board. The decision or resolution of the SCKP disqualifying an applicant for failure to submit the complete requirements on time shall be final. All the original documents and their photocopies shall be returned to the applicant.
- 34.7. In case the SCKP has determined, that there are three (3) or more qualified applicants, the SCKP through its Chairperson shall immediately send formal notices to the applicants inviting them to proceed with the succeeding phases of the search, i.e., the public presentation and panel interview to be held at the Kulliyyah premises.
- **34.8.** In case the SCKP has determined that there are less than three (3) applicants who have submitted applications or less than three (3) applicants who have qualified, the SCKP shall report the same to the Board.

#### Section 35. Evaluation Process and Recommendation of the SCKP to the Board.

 After the applicants have been qualified, the SCKP shall evaluate them based on the following criteria:

- d. No hold-over capacity shall exceed the period of six (6) months or one (1) semester. After the expiration of that period and no Kulliyyah President has been appointed, the Chief Minister shall designate an OIC-Kulliyyah President.

Section 41. Re-appointment of Kulliyyah President under Secondment. - The reappointment of the Kulliyyah President under secondment shall, aside from complying with the requirements prescribed in this IRR. strictly adhere to the requirements of the Civil Service Commission (CSC) Memorandum Circular No. 15, s. 1999 as amended by CSC Resolution No. 06-1165 dated July 5, 2006, the Guidelines on Secondment, and the applicable provisions of the Omnibus Rules on Appointments and Other Human Resource Actions (ORA-OHRA, Revised July 2018) issued by the CSC.

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Section 42. Appointment of New Kulliyyah President after Permanent Vacancy Occurs. – In case a new Kulliyyah President is appointed by the Chief Minister after a permanent vacancy occurs in the Office of the Kulliyyah President but during the term of office of the original appointee, the new Kulliyyah President shall be appointed in accordance with Civil Service rules and this IRR and the new Kulliyyah President shall be entitled to hold office only for the unexpired term. The new Kulliyyah President may be eligible for reappointment to another term. The service of the new Kulliyyah President for the unexpired term shall not count as a term for purposes of appointment and reappointment.

 **Section 43. Powers and Duties.** – The Kulliyyah President shall be in charge with the administration of the Kulliyyah with the following specific powers, functions, duties, and responsibilities:

- Carry out the general policies laid down by the Board and shall have the power to act within the ambit of said general policies and shall have general supervision of all business and financial operations of the Kulliyyah. He/She shall direct or assign the details of executive action.
- Recommend disciplinary action against any member of the Kulliyyah personnel, faculty or non-faculty as well as any student of the Kulliyyah for violations of Kulliyyah policies and guidelines or existing laws, rules and regulations.
- 3. Serve as the official medium of communication among the faculty, employees, students, the Board, and Councils.
- 4. Preside at commencement exercises and other public programs and official functions of the *Kulliyyah* and confer such degrees and honors as granted by the Board. All diplomas and certificates issued by the *Kulliyyah* shall be signed by him/her.
- 5. Submit an annual report to the Board on the work of the past year and needs for the current year. He/She shall also present to the Board the annual budget of the *Kulliyyah* with estimates of income and expenditures, including the short, medium, and long-term development and investment plans.
- 6. The *Kulliyyah* President shall discharge the following specific duties, authorities, and powers in accordance with existing laws, rules, and regulations:
  - a. Endorse resignation of the officials, faculty members, and employees to the Minister.

## RULE IX THE KULLIYYAH SECRETARY

**Section 48. Secretary of the Kulliyyah.** – The Kulliyyah Secretary shall serve as the Secretary for the Board and Councils.

He/She shall, among others, keep all the records and the minutes of the proceedings of the Board and shall communicate to the Chairperson, Vice-Chairpersons, and members of the Board notice of all regular meetings, special sessions, and other undertakings of the Board. The *Kulliyyah* President must ensure, through the Board Secretary, the preparation of the agenda folders for Board Meetings to be provided to the Chairperson, Vice-Chairpersons, and members at least five (5) days prior to any regular meeting and one (1) day prior to a special session.

In the absence of the Board Secretary for a scheduled meeting, an alternate Secretary may be designated by the Board for purposes of taking the minutes of the proceedings of the Board and assisting the Kulliyyah President.

- **Section 49. Designation.** The Kulliyyah Secretary shall be designated from among those holding a plantilla position in the Kulliyyah and who has demonstrated exemplary service and possesses the necessary qualifications and experience to perform the duties of the Secretary.
- **Section 50. Term of Office.** The Kulliyyah Secretary shall serve concurrently with the Kulliyyah President's term, after which the Kulliyyah Secretary shall revert to their permanent position, unless he/she is redesignated.

1070 Section 51. Transition of Records. - The Kulliyyah Secretary shall continue to 1071 perform the duties of the office until a new Secretary is designated. ## RULE XVII REVISION, AMENDMENT, AND EFFECTIVITY

- **Section 75.** Revision and Amendment. This IRR may be revised or amended by the MBHTE upon the recommendation of the Board: Provided, that a Committee shall be created to study and review any proposal to revise or amend this IRR before the MBHTE.
- **Section 76.** *Effectivity.* This IRR shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication in any newspaper of general circulation and after filing/deposit with the Office of the National Administrative Register (ONAR), U.P. Law Center, Quezon City.
